Certified Substance Abuse Counselors (CSACs)	10 hours per year	Topics relevant to substance use disorder treatment	Yes	NBCC, APA	Must enhance clinical knowledge and treatment skills.



Certified Substance Abuse Counseling Assistants (CSAC-As)	5 hours per year	Topics relevant to substance use disorder treatment	Yes	NBCC, APA	CE supports progression toward CSAC.
Qualified Mental Health Professionals (QMHPs)	8 hours per year	Topics relevant to behavioral health service delivery	Yes	APA, NBCC	Requirements may vary by agency or Medicaid credentialing.
Registered Peer Recovery Specialists (RPRSs)	8 hours per year	1 hour in ethics; 2 hours in core peer recovery competencies	Yes	APA, NBCC	Initial certification may require in-person training, but CE can be completed online.
